

## Approval of Annual Budget and Annual Plan 2017-2018

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The District Mineral Foundation Trust, Virudhunagar Proceedings in KV1/588/2017 dated 29.08.2017. In the DMFT account a sum of Rs.9,27,57,382/- has been collected upto the month of 31.03.2018 the Government /Chairperson of DMFT.

The Trust can utilize not exceeding five percentage of the fund for administrative, supervisory and overhead costs or establishment expenses of the foundation and one percentage of the fund for state administrative expenses. Provided further that the Trust may bear an expenditure upto three percentage from and within the five percentage of its accrued funds for the services of the personnel appointed from the Government departments or from regular employees of the District Panchayat or such other cadre as may be decided by the Government, for providing administrative and technical assistance to the Trust 6% of the DMFT amount of Rs.55,65,443/- for the year 2017-2018.

As per Rule 13(3) and (4) of TNDMF Rules, 2017, the Trust fund has to be utilized in the 60:40 ratio for the following High Priority and other priority projects with the available funds.
